Be a Host Family:

Help medical students understand the experiences of families of children with disabilities

Participate in the Seminar on Family Centered Care & Developmental Disabilities, Rutgers Robert Wood Johnson Medical School!

- The seminar is held 8 times a year.
- Families can host as often as they want, usually 2-4 times per year.
- Most visits last 2-3 hours. State and end timing are flexible. All members of the family are welcome to participate.

Participating families will receive an initial orientation, with on-going support available throughout the year.



→ Your role:

- Meet with a small group of medical students either in your home over dinner or by Zoom
- Share your family's experience with raising a child with a disability and interacting with health professionals
- Contribute to the education of future medical professionals
